The Town voted, with respect to each revolving fund established by the preceding vote, to receive from each of those boards, departments and offices having charge of a revolving fund a report showing the total amount of receipts and expenditures for each revolving fund for Fiscal Years 2013 and Fiscal Year 2014 through Fiscal year December 31, 2013 and also showing an amount of the increase, if any, in spending authority granted by the Selectmen and Advisory Committee with respect to such revolving funds during Fiscal Year 2013 and Fiscal Year 2014 through December 31, 2013.

# Article 6. ENTERPRISE FUND TRANSFER STATION

The Town voted to appropriate the following amounts for the Transfer Station Enterprise Fund:

# Article 7. COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

The Town voted to accept the recommendations of the Community Preservation Committee as follows.

To appropriate \$22,000 from the Community Preservation Fund for the Parks and Recreation Department to complete the stream bank restoration and stabilization project at Memorial Park.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

To appropriate \$42,000 from the Community Preservation Fund to contribute to the purchase of approximately 11 acres adjacent to the Memorial Park, referred to as the West Brook Conservation Project Phase II, contingent upon approval and receipt of a land grant from the Commonwealth as requested by the Minnechaug Land Trust.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

To appropriate \$250 from the Community Preservation Fund for payment of the annual membership fee in the Community Preservation Coalition for the fiscal year 2014.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 8. CONSERVATION FUND

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$1,000 for the Conservation fund, said fund to be used for the purpose of acquiring available land for the Town for conservation purposes, if said purchase is voted and approved at Annual or Special Town Meeting prior to such purchase.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 9. HIGHWAY STATE AID

The Town voted to accept \$258,112 from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under the provision of local aid fund distribution, the General Laws Chapter 90, Section 34, and be allowed to borrow in anticipation of reimbursement.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 10. LIBRARY ADDITIONAL STATE AID

The Town voted that, in Fiscal Year 2014, if State Aid is received for the Library, this money will be made available for Library Trustees to use at their discretion.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 11. BOARD OF ASSESSORS

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$10,000 to the Assessor's Stabilization Fund to meet Department of Revenue mandated programs.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 12. BOARD OF ASSESSORS

The Town voted to transfer from the Assessor's Stabilization Fund \$10,200 for all FY2014 Revaluation Year services.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 13. HIGHWAY INFRASTRUCTURE

The Town voted to appropriate \$2,000,000 to fund road, intersection and drainage improvements and reconstruction, consisting of the resurfacing thereof with bituminous concrete or other road material, including leveling, structural overlays, utility adjustments, minor drainage improvements and curbing, the replacement of culverts and for design, permitting, appraisals, permanent and temporary easements, construction and services during construction and project contingency, and that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$2,000,000 under GL C44 s7 or an other enabling authority; that the Board of Selectmen is authorized to acquire, accept as a gift, or take by eminent domain permanent and / or temporary easements for such drainage system improvements; and that the Board of Selectmen is authorized to take any other action necessary to carry out this project; provided, however, that this vote will not take effect until the Town votes to exempt from the limitation on the total taxes imposed by GL C59, s 21C (Proposition 2 1.2) so called, amounts required to pay the principal of and interest on the borrowing authorized by this vote.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 14. HIGHWAY – EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT

The Town voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$24,000 to replace the brush chipper for the Highway Department.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 15. HIGHWAY - EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT

The Town voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$12,000 to replace a one ton asphalt roller for the Highway Department.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 16. HIGHWAY - EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT

The Town voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$8,800 to replace a 52" riding mower for the Highway Department.

The Town voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$42,000 to install a new standing seam roof on the shed and garage at the Highway Department.

# Article 19. SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$10,967 to fund the School Resource Officer for FY2013 at Minnechaug Regional High School.

## Article 20. WATER RESOLUTION

The Town voted to transfer from overlay surplus a sum not to exceed \$44,000 to cover the cost of providing water to those homes whose wells have been adversely impacted by runoff from the Town's salt shed.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 21. WEST BROOK ACQUISITION

The Town voted that the Town apply \$42,000 in CPA funds, pursuant to MGL C44 s12a and authorize the Treasurer to borrow up to \$64,000, all toward the purchase of the parcel known as West Brook Phase II, consisting of 11 acres, more or less, as shown as Parcel 5 on a plan entitled "Plan of Land, Mountain Road in Hampden" by Paul Smith Land Surveyors, for the purpose of conservation and passive recreation; that said land be conveyed to the Town of Hampden under the provisions of MGL Ch. 40, Section 8c, subject to conservation restrictions in favor of Minnechaug Land Trust in accordance with MGL C184, to be managed and controlled by the Conservation Commission. This purchase is subject to approval of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts LAND grant program.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 22. ZONING BYLAW – TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON MEDICAL MAIJUANA TREATMENT CENTERS

# Article 1. POLICE STATION BUILDING STUDY

The Town voted to transfer \$1,000 from unappropriated available funds to purchase supplies for a presentation by the Police Station Building Study Committee.

The Town voted to transfer \$10,000 from unappropriated available funds to purchase fittings, parts and material for dry hydrants to be installed by the Fire Department.

The Town voted to transfer \$20,000 from unappropriated available funds for a generator for the Highway Department.

A majority vote was declared by the moderator.

# Article 4. WELL WATER CONNECTION

The Town voted to transfer \$25,000 from unappropriated available funds to finalize the water connection work for 593-595 Main Street. 601 Main Street and 613 Main Street.

A majority vote was declared by the moderator.

# Article 5. WEST BROOK ACQUISITION

The Town voted to ratify and confirm the vote taken with respect to Article 21 on the warrant for the annual town meeting on April 29, 2013 except that the phrase "as contained in General Laws Chapter 132A. Section 11" be added to the final sentence of that motion so that, as amended, the final sentence reads as follows: "This purchase is subject to approval of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts LAND grant program as contained in General Laws Chapter 132A, Section 11."

The finances of the town are sound. Cash flow has been very good requiring very little borrowing and then mostly from internal sources for short terms. Of course we do sometimes have to borrow for capital purchases, but the rates have been very good for these short term notes.

Tax collections have been very prompt which is quite helpful. I find the people you trust to manage the town for the most part are a pretty good team. People keep an eye on other people with the spirit of helping them do a good job rather than catching them not doing well.

We certainly face some challenges going forward. Resources are finite and judgments need to be made on what services we need versus what we can afford to pay for, but I am at least confident pretty much everyone is trying to do their best.

In the past year, we also completed a significant amount of trimming of roadside trees. This is an expensive but necessary task given that most low hanging limbs have to be removed with the assistance of a tree service and towns are responsible for maintaining a clear travel lane with 14-feet clearance. The trimming done was funded by a special appropriation at Special Town meeting in 2011. It is also important to remember that the removal of poor town trees reduces exposure to personal injury, property damage, and power outages. It also improves the overall appearance of the town.

# DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' SERVICES

For this office, 2013 was especially productive and very busy.

On January 4, 2013, after a complete review of our operations by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Department of Veterans' Services, it was determined this office (the district) *has been* ..."adhering to the legal requirements for veterans' services districts, has been meeting DVS' uniform standards and continues to demonstrate that sufficient benefits and services are being provided adequately to veterans and their eligible dependents residing in the towns of East Longmeadow, Hampden, Holland, Monson and Wales". With that statement, the Secretary of Veterans' Services granted us continuation of operations as a district until October 2014. On behalf of the board for the district, I know we are all very proud of this accomplishment.

We can report reimbursements of the monies expended by each of the town in the district, on behalf of our veterans, are proceeding as expected. The 75% reimbursements are being provided to the town as the system is programmed to do. In one town (East Longmeadow) it was discovered the town was not being reimbursed for cemetery flags which are placed in the cemeteries on the graves of veterans for Memorial Day. Once this error was discovered, a correction was made and reimbursement from the state for flags for 2013 was submitted and approved. Unfortunately, prior years could not be reclaimed.

On August 14, 2013 as part of our continued efforts to reach out to veterans, a cook-out for veterans was held at the Senior Center in Hampden. Veterans from the entire district were invited and approximately fifty (50) veterans, along with their spouses (in some cases) enjoyed the company of fellow vets and along with enjoying good food, their questions were answered concerning veterans' benefits. It was good to note that veterans from each of the five (5) towns were in attendance and all of the uniformed services were represented. More of these types of events are in the planning stage for 2014.

During the new year (2104) this office will continue its efforts to reach as many veterans as possible, to explain Chapter 115 Benefits and to get them the benefits they deserve.

To any veteran reading this report, we thank you for your service to your country.
