Town of Hampden Newsletter – June 2018

Help Save the Hampden Historical Society!

Right now, there is a great need for interested residents and nonresidents to step forward, and help this non-profit group stay in existence. The past several years have seen the aging of the once active membership: at least two members are in their early 90s, while others are 'young' 70+ year olds, and then mostly middle-aged individuals. Currently volunteers are working on setting up a website, and a Facebook page for the Society.

Individuals from age 18 and older are needed to revitalize this group. It's not a matter of money, but of volunteers to make things happen: program ideas, docents, speakers, officers, and more. The dues are nominal at \$5 for an individual, and \$10 for a family. To become a member, make out check to: Hamp-den Historical Society, and mail to P. O. Box 363, Hampden, MA 01036, include any suggestions for programs, or other comments, and then offer to volunteer at least once a year.

The Society meets in the town-owned Academy Hall, on Main Street opposite the Town House, typically from May to September. The **Wednesday, June 13th meeting** will begin at 6:30pm with a pizza party, followed by Jim Kellner speaking on genealogy. Check the *Times* for upcoming programs.

Editor's Note: The Historical Society's official incorporated name is the 'Historical Society of the Town of Hampden, Inc.', and should not be confused with the Hampden Historical Commission, which is a governmental multi-member public body, with responsibilities outlined in the MA General Law's Chapter 40, Section 8D "... for the preservation, protection and development of the historical or archeological assets of such city or town..."

This Newsletter usually only has articles from our town's governmental bodies; however, one of the Selectmen requested this article to help re-energize this group that has, for decades, been an informative source about our town's history, and maintains their memorabilia in two museum areas at Academy Hall.

From Cliff Bombard, Town Accountant....the following, originally written for this Newsletter, was the top half of a full sheet handout at the Finance Workshop held in April.

"WHAT IS "FREE CASH"?

Well actually, it is a bit of a misnomer to call it "Free". While it is surely cash as it certainly was not free. It is all related to the taxes paid by citizens. At the end of each Fiscal Year, I submit a report to the Department of Revenue detailing all general Fund activity. From that they calculate our "Free Cash". How do they do it?

Since not all Appropriation expenditures raised in the tax rate are expended; and since we have traditionally estimated our Local and State revenues conservatively the net overage of these revenues along with the unexpended Appropriations are the major components of the calculation. From that net they deduct any Fund Deficits which are usually State Grant monies we have to spend in anticipation of revenue.

So here's how last year's Free Cash was calculated

Excess Local Revenues	\$266,233.00
Other non-estimated Revenues	\$ 94,450.00
Unused Appropriations	\$206,733.00
Fund Deficits	\$- 51,416.00



These total to \$516,000.00. This combined total was appropriated in the November Town Meeting with \$178,000 to various appropriations and \$338,000 to reduce the tax rate."
