



Town of Hampden Newsletter September 2018

This month's focus will begin a series on town documents:

At the last Capital Planning Meeting, back on July 12th, there was mention of the Hampden Town Hall Capital Improvement and Accessibility Study. That study is dated May 22, 2017 and was prepared by Marois Construction Company, Inc. *(http://maroisconstruction.com/)* and lists Architecture Environment Life Inc. as consultants.

In the "Introduction" on p2, the second paragraph starts "This report looks at existing condition of the Town Hall while noting code compliance deficiencies, highlighting deferred maintenance items; and producing a preliminary budget for upgrading the former Town Police Station area into functional office space."

Information is based on "inspections during site visits, no functional or destructive testing has been performed... The report that follows is preliminary in nature and intended for informational purposes only..." That section ends with stating that before any work begins testing for asbestos would have to be done "to determine the scope of any abatement work required."

"Appendix A: Projected Cost Breakdown" on p31 lists a preliminary estimate for 'code compliance upgrades'; while p32-33 deals with the "Basement Remodel of PD space"; and ends with p34, which deals with "Maintenance and repairs". The last section of the report includes the following three fold-out drawings: The first, dated March 14, 2017, Architecture Environment Life Inc. of East Longmeadow depicts a possible layout of offices, and bathrooms in the space once occupied by the Hampden Police Department.

The second fold-out plan, dated October 13, 1989, and prepared by Carlson & Schmitt Architects, Inc. is entitled "Upper Level Repairs and Renovations to the Hampden Town House" with remarks. The final fold-out, October 31, 2016, and by Precision Measurement & Drafting Services, LLC shows an annotated partial basement plan.

There are charts, color photos, diagrams, and explanations throughout the report. This report should be viewed as a 'must read" as we go into the future. The explanation of renovation costs less or greater than 30% of the building's value is covered in p3-4.

This report may be read at either the library, or the Senior Center. A digital copy is available at hampden.org on the home page.



(Editor's Note: In order to read the remarks on the paper copies of the latter two plans, you may need a magnifying glass. Those two fold-outs are better viewed using the paper copies vs the digital copy.)

Think about some of these questions: On the 2016 and 1989 plans, how many of those items were actually implemented? How much did these three plans cost? Is there a timeline to go forward on any of the maintenance repairs; the remodel of the former Police Dept. area; or the American Disabilities Act compliance items? Since this report was finished, the cupola has been leaking. What's that current status? Flashback to the 1982 Annual Town Report, Report of the Board of Selectmen, p.14, 4th paragraph down: (viewable online at Hampden.org)

"This year, 1982, marked the 50th "birthday" of our Town House and some of you may not be aware of the fact that this great building was a gift to our Town by a philanthropic old time resident, Miss Elizabeth Sessions. Since she was not only interested in community affairs but also deeply concerned with education, this building was a combination school, town hall and library, and housed grades 1-8 for many years, only finally ending its service as a school in 1971. Not many towns are so fortunate to receive such a gift and throughout the years your



selectmen have done whatever is necessary to keep this building in the best possible condition. This year we will have to address ourselves to the problems of the roof on this building, one section of which needs immediate repair."

The Town House is located across the street from Academy Hall, which was used at times for town meetings.
