

State Election Early Voting:

"For your convenience, you are able to cast your November 6th state election ballot before Election Day." per the red "**Information for Voters**" booklet from the Secretary of the Commonwealth William Francis Galvin.

The booklet arrived late September via mail.

Thursday, November 1st, and Friday Nov 2nd are the last Early Voting dates. Those Early Voting sessions will be held at the Town House, 625 Main Street, during regular business hours of 9AM - 3 PM.



November 6th: State Election Day

Voting hours are 7AM – 8PM at the Town House.

That booklet lists 13 offices for our area. The inside back page has a handy Voter Checklist. Just fill it in, tear it off, and bring it with you. Pages 4-15 in the front have information about the three ballot questions, while the rest of the booklet has voting information.

A Warm Welcome to our first Town Administrator: Mary McNally

The Selectmen and McNally signed her contract in October, and the Town Administrator's office, located in the lower level across from the Selectmen's Office, was finished soon after. That space was once part of the former police station.

As Tyler McQuillan* reported: "McNally, a practicing attorney and former director of Springfield's Parking Authority, was picked as a top candidate by the Search Committee because of her experience.

Her depth of legal knowledge and experience overseeing personnel and coordinating large projects were identified as assets to the town."
