

A Selectmen's Initiative to provide timely information and governmental transparency

Selectmen's Message by John D. Flynn:

We would like to thank you, our neighbors, who continue to support our Town, by voting for an expansion of the highway garage, as well as studies to upgrade the fire station, public safety communications and the senior center. The results of the studies will be brought to the voters for action at a Town Meeting, either in the fall or next spring.

Also, we would like to thank Vinnie Villamaino and Norm Charest for their service on the Board of Selectmen, and we also extend our thanks to Fire Chief Mike Gorski, Deputy Chief Dave Markham, and Jane Budynkiewicz. All of them have given so much of their time and talent to the town and we all are extremely grateful! (Editor's note: Markham has resigned from the Deputy Chief position, and Budynkiewicz has resigned from the H.F.D.'s clerical position.)

Don't Rush to Flush: MEDS in the BIN, We all WIN!

So states a flyer from the Hampden Wilbraham Partners for Youth, available in the Upper Hallway of the Town House, left side on the free/informational bench. This is just a reminder that residents can drop off any unwanted meds (**pills only**) at the Hampden Police Station on Allen Street, which is open 24/7.

The flyer notes that it is a 'safe disposal, no questions asked.' opportunity. Very important: "Do NOT flush in the toilet – medications may harm the water supply."

Grassroots Group Discussing Digital Recording of town committee meetings

The June 13th issue of *The Wilbraham-Hampden Times* had a front page article entitled "Committee explores meeting broadcasts' (June 3rd Board of Selectmen's meeting) which was continued on page 7. There was also a "Viewpoints" editorial "Televised meetings benefit the community." In which the 4th paragraph listed some of the benefits.

In both, Mary Ellen Glover was inadvertently referred to as being a member of the citizen's group; she was not. She spoke independently about her experiences as a school committee member. This editor contacted Tyler Witkop, *Times* editor, and explained that Glover wasn't a member of the group. So for the record, only three of the group's members were present: John Plaster, Craig Rivest, and Ted Zebert. The fourth member, former Selectman Jim Smith, was unable to make that June 3rd meeting. (*Editor's Disclosure: married to Ted Z*).

The grassroots group held a meeting Saturday, June 15th, and a few people attended. The discussions covered various pros & cons of several issues. One resident said that if the minutes

were more detailed then there would be no need for recording meetings. Other issues included recordings being town sponsored or by an independent nonprofit. If the town used Charter's public access option then there would be a fee on every Hampden Charter customer's bill (not all residents subscribe to Charter) vs an independent nonprofit doing fund raising thus no Charter bill fee, and little to no tax dollar used.

Backstory: September 8, 2015 a Charter representative was on the Selectmen's agenda to discuss public access. Selectmen Flynn suggested using the police station area once it was vacated. (That space is currently being used for office spaces.) There were unanswered questions at that time. A Charter person was going to contact the Selectmen's office in early October. There was even talk of a draft public access article for the Annual Town Meeting in the Spring of 2016. This Editor will make a Records request to find out what, if anything, happened in October 2015.

Back to the end of the June 15th meeting: the group's goal is to make a recording of one or two meetings, upload them to probably Youtube, and then ask for resident's comments/suggestions. There will be additional community members needed not only to get this proposal off the ground, but to sustain the effort. At the end of the meeting, one resident said that after a Selectmen's meeting he hears from a few of his friends, and there are different stories. He is in favor of watching a video on his own, and forming his own opinion. How this works out depends on the vast majority of you, the residents.
