

Town of Hampden Newsletter November 2019



From the Interim Town Administrator Robert Markel:

It is a busy time in Hampden. The Selectmen, the Planning Board and the Advisory Committee are holding hearings to review the Warrant for the October 28 Special Town Meeting. There are twenty articles ranging from a by-law to regulate solar projects to financial articles that will impact the tax rate. The warrant articles with explanations and motions is available on the Town website: https://www.hampdenma.gov. I hope that you will all make the effort to attend.

Town officials have been grappling with two critical issues this month: 1) ambulance services; and 2) dead and hazardous trees. The Town currently uses AMR Ambulance services. Our dilemma is that East Longmeadow is dropping its contract with AMR in favor of a municipally run service. This has resulted in AMR relocating their ambulances to a greater distance from the Town of Hampden with negative effects on response time. The Selectmen and I are working to find ambulance services with far better response times.

Lastly, the problem with dead and hazardous trees is a priority. Tree Warden Dana Pixley has estimated that there are 350-60 trees in the public right-of-way that threaten homes and roadways that must be removed. Over the past two years, the gypsy moth infestation has decimated the Town's oak trees. Taking down these dead trees will be very costly. The Selectmen are exploring ways to fund tree removal with reserve funds instead of raising taxes. The total cost could exceed \$300,000.

Editor's Note: Per an Oct 10th phone conversation with Dana Pixley, he emphasized safety as a priority so that no large branches, and trees would fall on electric wires, and/or the roadways or block roads with no exit. He has contracted with a tree service. There were about 35 trees removed by the 10th.

A priority was streets with no egress such as Mountain Road, Sessions Dr at the intersection of Baldwin Dr (before the culvert 'bridge'), and Pondview Dr. Next on his list will be trees along primary roads.

"History of the Gypsy Moth in MA

The gypsy moth, *Lymantria dispar*, has been a costly and persistent problem in Massachusetts since its introduction in 1869. This invasive pest causes tree defoliation through its spring feeding in the caterpillar life stage. The first major defoliation in event in Massachusetts occurred in 1889. It is at this point Massachusetts state agencies became involved and began efforts to control gypsy moths. Gypsy moth management began as a labor intensive process, including removing egg mass and applying treatments by hand. As technology advanced, the use of spray trucks and eventually aerial pesticide applications (including the use of DDT) were used. Despite continued efforts of control, they (sic) gypsy moth spread to every city and town in Massachusetts by 1922 and has remained a major threat to forest health in the state."
