Income guidelines for 1 person household—\$2,127; Income guidelines for 2 person household—\$2,873

BROWN BAG: NEW INCOME GUIDELINES-Free bag of groceries once a month in conjunction with the Food Bank of Western MA. Participants must be 55 or older and meet the following monthly income guidelines:

Income guidelines for 1 person household—\$2,096; Income guidelines for 2 person household—\$2,823 NEXT PICK-UP IS TUESDAY, September 20th, BETWEEN 1:30-2:30pm.

**EMERGENCY FUEL FUND:** Available to any Hampden resident who is in a heating crisis. A resident must have received a shut off notice from the electric company, have less than a quarter of a tank of oil, or be in another emergency heating situation. Please call for more information or to find out if you qualify for assistance. All information provided is confidential.

**REGISTRY OF MOTOR VEHICLES:** RMV related questions or help with processing RMV applications online. Beginning May 3, 2023, every air traveler 18 years of age and older will need a REAL ID compliant driver's license or ID card, state-issued enhanced driver's license, or another TSA acceptable form of ID at airport security checkpoints for domestic air travel...

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC benefit program that helps ensure that households can afford the broadband they need for work, school, healthcare and more.

The benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Affordable Connectivity Program is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

#### Who Is Eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program?

A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the <u>Federal Poverty Guidelines</u>, or if a member of the household meets at least *one* of the criteria below:

Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year;

Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income internet program;

Participates in one of these assistance programs:

The National School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA

### **Real Estate Tax Exemptions**

The Town of Hampden offers Real Estate Tax Exemptions for those who qualify. The Assessor's Office is currently accepting applications for FY2023.

#### Senior Exemption (Clause 41C) – \$750.00

To qualify for this exemption, you must be 70 years or older, have been a resident of Massachusetts for at least 10 years, own and occupy the home for at least 5 years, and meet the income and asset

requirements. The annual income cannot exceed \$20,000 for a single person and \$30,000 for a married couple. Total assets as of July 1st cannot exceed \$30,000 for a single person and \$35,000 for a married couple.

#### **Veteran Exemption (Clause 22) – \$400.00**

The veteran must have a service-connected disability rating of 10% or higher, have been a Massachusetts resident for at least 1 year, and own the property as of July 1st.

#### Veteran Exemption (Clause 22E) – \$1,000.00

The veteran must have a service-connected disability rating of 100%, have been a Massachusetts resident for at least 1 year, and own the property as of July 1st.

#### Surviving Spouse of a Veteran Exemption (Clause 22D) – Full Tax Exemption

The veteran must have died as a direct result from an injury sustained or an illness contracted during their time in active duty. The surviving spouse must own the property as of July 1st, have been domiciled in Massachusetts at least 5 consecutive years before applying for the exemption, or the deceased veteran or service or guard member must have been domiciled in Massachusetts at least 6 consecutive months before entering the service.

#### Blind Exemption (Clause 37) – \$437.50

To qualify for this exemption, you must be legally blind own and occupy the property as of July 1st.

#### Surviving Spouse of a Police Officer or Firefighter (Clause 42 & 43) – Full Tax Exemption

To qualify for this exemption, you must be the surviving spouse or a minor child of a Police Officer or a Firefighter who was killed in the line of duty. Applicant must own the property as of July 1st.

#### <u>Property Tax Deferral – (Clause 41A) – Partial or Full Deferral of Real Property Tax</u>

This is an option for someone who is struggling to pay their taxes and wants to stay in their home. To qualify, you must be 65 years or older, have been a resident of Massachusetts for at least 10 years, own and occupy the home for at least 5 years, and meet the income requirements. Anyone with interest in the property must sign off on the deferral and the deferred taxes must be repaid with 8% interest.

The deadline to apply for an exemption is April 1st. Please contact the Assessor's Office for more information at (413) 566-2151 ext. 106. Our office hours are Monday – Thursday from 9:00am to 2:00pm.



#### NOTES FROM THE NURSE, Sheila Rucki PhD, PCNS, BC

There is no scarcity of cases of COVID in our state. The BA variant of the virus is spreading. This means there is no summer respite and a fall free of covid. It is likely there will be a continuing rise in infections and hospitalizations but not a surge in severe disease

unless you have chronic illness and have not been vaccinated or boosted.
