## Minutes

The Committee met to recap the GSC's First Forum held on December 12. Key takeaways are:

- Twelve (12) people attended the Forum.
  - What needs to happen to better engage the community?
- Board of Selectmen: Uncertainty that 5 is better that 3.
  - Term Limits: Would be helpful with a 3-person Board. It might also be beneficial to eliminate party designation and vote for an individual and not an affiliation.
- Elected vs Appointed town officials and pros and cons of each.
- Communication: How can residents be better informed? How to increase community engagement? For the 2023 STM, a single topic (Fiber Optic) drove attendance and about half the attendees left after that warrant article was voted on.
- Strong Town Administrator (TA) and a TA Assistant
- Website Update: Website should be more informative and easier to navigate. A Social Media Coordinator could add value.
- Electronic Voting at Town Meetings would increase efficiency and accuracy.
- Town Meetings on Saturday.
- Facilities Manager: How would the Town handle moving government functions to TWB should that decision be made? Need an individual responsible for Hampden's assets as the Town tends to allow deterioration.
- Town Operations: There's a tendency to not get things done.
- School District: Lighting fiasco; true costs with no explanation.

- Strengths: Town employees are responsive and friendly; ballot voting on paper; roads are well managed and plowed timely.
- Concerns: Communication
