### **Article 4. REVOLVING FUNDS**

The Town voted to authorize the Town, acting through its various departments, to establish the revolving funds as listed in Article 4 of the Annual Town Meeting warrant, in accordance with General Laws Chapter 44, Section 53E ½, separate from the general fund and deposited with the Town Treasurer, for the town departments, sources of receipts, and purposes of payment as printed in Article 4 of the warrant, with the funds in the respective revolving funds not to exceed the following amounts for Fiscal Year 2013:

Board of Assessors: \$ 2,500 Board of Health \$40,000

Building Department	\$50,000
Library Trustees	\$ 6,000

#### **Article 5. REVOLVING FUNDS**

The Town voted, with respect to each revolving fund established by the preceding vote, to receive from each of those boards, departments and offices having charge of a revolving fund a report showing the total amount of receipts and expenditures for each revolving fund for Fiscal Year 2012 and Fiscal Year 2013 through December 31, 2012 and also showing an amount of the increase, if any, in speeding authority granted by the Selectmen and Advisory Committee with respect to such revolving funds during Fiscal Year 2012 and Fiscal Year 2013 through December 31, 2012.

A Majority vote declared by the Moderator

### **Article 6. ENTERPRISE FUND TRANSFER STATION**

The Town voted to appropriate the following amounts for the Transfer Station Enterprise Fund: \$20,000 for salaries

\$80,000 for expenses

\$100,000 Total

And that \$100,000 be raised as follows:

Department receipts: \$80,000

Tax Levy: **\$20,000**

### Article 7. COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

The Town voted to accept the recommendations of the Community Preservation Committee as follows:

To appropriate \$4,350 from the Community Preservation Fund for the Town Clerk to create digital and microfiche copies of the vital Town records and to rebind the original volumes.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

To appropriate \$38,000 from the Community Preservation Fund to contribute to the purchase of approximately 22 acres adjacent to the Memorial Park, referred to as the West Brook Conservation Project, subject to approval and receipt of a Conservation Stewardship Grant, as requested by the Minnechaug Land Trust.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

To appropriate \$250 from the Community Preservation Fund for payment of the annual membership fee in the Community Preservation Coalition for fiscal year 2013.

Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator.

### **Article 8. CONSERVATION FUND**

The Town voted to raise and appropriate **\$1,000** for the Conservation fund, said fund to be used for the purpose of acquiring available land for the Town for conservation purposes, if said purchase is voted and approved at Annual or Special Town Meeting prior to such purchase.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

### **Article 9. HIGHWAY STATE AID**

The Town voted to accept \$258,112 from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under the provision of local aid fund distribution, the General Laws Chapter 90, Section 34, and be allowed to borrow in anticipation of reimbursement.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

# Article 10. LIBRARY ADDITIONAL STATE AID

The Town voted that, in Fiscal Year 2013, if State Aid is received for the Library, this money will be made available for Library Trustees to use at their discretion.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

#### Article 11. BOARD OF ASSESSORS

The Town voted to raise and appropriate **\$10,000** to the Assessor's Stabilization Fund to meet Department of Revenue mandated programs.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

#### Article 12. BOARD OF ASSESSORS

The Town voted to transfer from the Assessor's Stabilization Fund \$10,000 for all FY2013 Revaluation Year services.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

## Article 13. DUMP TRUCK REPLACMENT

The Town voted to raise and appropriate and/ or borrow \$200,000 for the purpose of replacing the 1989 Mack Dump Truck and sander and plow; that to meet this appropriation the Town will raise and appropriate \$50,000 and the Treasurer, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$150,000 under GL C44s7(9) or any other enabling authority; and that the Board of Selectmen is authorized to take any action necessary to carry out this project;

## Article 14. DARE PROGRAM

The Town voted to take no action.

## Article 15. SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

The Town voted to raise and appropriate **\$10,700** to fund the School Resource Officer for FY12 at Minnechaug Regional High School.

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$30,000 for town house improvements.

### Article 19. WEST BROOK ACQUISITION

The Town voted to expend \$38,000 raised pursuant to Article 7 toward the purchase of the land described in Article 19 of the warrant for this meeting for the purposes described in that Article, this expenditure to be conditioned upon approval and receipt of a Conservation Stewardship Grant in the amount of \$38,000.

The Town voted to amend the General Bylaw, Chapter VIII, Section 6, as described in the Warrant Article 20.
