Article 4 (Craig Rivest) FY2023 SPENDING LIMITS FOR REVOLVING FUNDS

The Town voted to authorize the following total expenditures for the following revolving funds, in amounts not to exceed the listed amounts, pursuant to General Laws chapter 44, Section 53E ½ for the Fiscal Year 2023:

Article 5 (John Flynn) ENTERPRISE FUND TRANSFER STATION

The Town voted to appropriate the following amounts for the Transfer Station Enterprise Fund for Fiscal 2023:

\$31,000 for Salaries

\$60,000 for Trash Hauling & MRF Contract

\$1,500 for Miscellaneous Expenses

\$92,500 - Total

And that \$92,500 be raised as follows:

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 6 (Doug Boyd) COMMUNITY PRESERVATION COMMITTEE

The Town voted to appropriate \$29,406 from the Community Preservation Fund for the purpose of renovating a playing field at Minnechaug Regional High School, contingent upon passing of Wilbraham's portion at the Wilbraham Town Meeting.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

The Town voted to appropriate \$28,000 from the Community Preservation Fund for the purpose of changing the door locks at Centennial Commons.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 7 (Ted Zebert / Judy M-B) CONSERVATION FUND

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$1,000 for the Conservation Fund, said fund to be used for the purpose of acquiring available land in the Town for conservation purposes, if said purchase is voted and approved at an Annual or Special Town Meeting prior to such purchase.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 8 (Don Davenport) CHAPTER 90 - STATE HIGHWAY AID

The Town voted to accept \$251,978 from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under General Laws, Chapter 90, Section 34, and be allowed to borrow in anticipation of 100% reimbursement.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 9 (Library - EM) LIBRARY ADDITIONAL STATE AID

The Town voted that in fiscal year 2023, if state aid is received for the Hampden public library, this money will be made available to Hampden Library Trustees for use at their discretion.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 10 (Norm Charest) ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION FOR ASSESSORS

The Town voted to accept Chapter 59, Section 21A of the Massachusetts General Laws to create a financial incentive for the Town's assessors to become certified.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 11 (Don Davenport) ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION FOR COLLECTORS AND TREASURERS The Town voted to accept Chapter 41, Section 108P of the Massachusetts General Laws to create a financial incentive for the Town's Treasurers and Collectors to achieve certification

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 12 (Norm Charest) TRANSFER ASSESSORS' STABILIZATION FUNDS TO THE GENERAL FUND The Town voted to close out the Assessors Stabilization Fund and transfer the remaining balance of \$508.32 in said account to the Town's General Fund.

A 2/3 Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 13 (Norm Charest) ASSESSOR'S FUNDING FOR STATE MANDATED PROGRAMS
The Town voted transfer \$50,000 from the Assessors' Overlay reserve to enable the Board of Assessors to comply with Massachusetts Department of Revenue mandated programs.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 14 (John Flynn) SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$11,650 to pay for the School Resource Officer for fiscal year 2022 at Minnechaug Regional High School.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 15 (Craig Rivest) MUNICIPAL LIGHT PLANT

The Town voted by secret ballot to authorize the Board of Selectmen to take appropriate action to establish and to maintain, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 164 of the General Laws and in accordance with the rules, regulations and orders of the Department of Public Utilities and the Department of Telecommunications & Cable, a municipal lighting plant for all purposes allowable under the laws of the Commonwealth, including without limitation the operation of a telecommunications system and any related services.

Motion carried by Secret Ballot vote: YES - 79 / NO - 10

Article 16 (Don Davenport) SPECIAL ACT FOR A HAMPDEN FIREFIGHTER

The Town voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to file a Special Act with the Massachusetts General Court to permit Hampden firefighter, Peter Hatch, to continue serving past the normal age of 65 until potentially 70 years of age.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 17 (Assessors) LOCAL OPTION RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR VETERANS EXEMPTION
The Town voted to adopt the local option to permit veterans to qualify for veterans' exemptions of
Chapter 59, section 5, clauses 22 and 22A through 22F after residing in Massachusetts for one (1) year.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 18 (Don Davenport) POCEDURE FOR FILLING BOARD & COMMITTEE VACANCIES The Town voted to take no action on this article.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 19 (Tad Brown) CITIZEN'S PETITION

The Town voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to investigate and if feasible to negotiate a purchase and sale agreement for certain properties and parcels of land currently known as 2 Somers Road (5.81 acres-Parcel ID 12-40-0) and 16 Somers Road (3.47 acres Parcel ID 12-039-000) and or any portion thereof or take any other action upon terms that the Board of Selectmen deem to be in the best interest of the Town.

Motion carried by a Majority Vote of: YES-44 / NO - 31

Article 20 (Advisory) ADVISORY COMMITTEE RESERVE FUND

The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$25,000 for the Advisory Committee Reserve Fund for Fiscal

2023. A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 21 (Advisory) GENERAL STABILIZATION FUND

The Town voted to take no action on this article.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator

Article 22 (Advisory) REDUCING THE TAX RATE

The Town voted to take no action on this article.

A Majority Vote was declared by the Moderator
