been employed.

We do not claim perfection: many things might be improved; but taking all things into consideration we feel confident that the schools were never in a better condition than now.

Maps and charts have been supplied, and everything necessary to the better improvement of the pupils

has been furnished.

We have made extensive repairs in school No. 3, laying a floor, sheathing the walls, and furnishing new seats; altogether making the schoolroom pleasant and attractive. In No. 2 school the rooms have been painted and repaired. No. 1 schoolhouse has been partly shingled, the ceiling whitewashed, and walls painted. The floor in the primary department has been relayed and the fence around the grounds has been made over. At No. 4, new glass has been put in the windows and shutters put on for protection. This building needs to be thoroughly repaired. From present indications, the time is not far distant when it will be needed for school purposes. We think it would be economy for the town to give each of the schoolhouses at least one coat of paint.
