TOWN WARRANT

COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS. Hampden, ss.

To A. G. Corey, Constable of the Town of Hampden, Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hampden, qualified to vote in elections and Town affairs, to meet at Academy Hall, on Monday, the fifth day of April next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. Choose a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, three Selectmen, who shall be Overseers of the Poor, one Assessor for three years, one School Committee for three years, one Collector of Taxes, three Constables, three Fence Viewers, one Cemetery Commissioner for three years, one Road Commissioner for three years and one for one year, one Tree Warden, one Library Trustee for three years, and one Auditor, all on one ballot; also to choose all other necessary Town Officers. The polls open at eleven a. m. and may close at three p. m.

Article 3. To vote by ballot, which shall be "Yes" or "No," in answer to the question, "Shall license for the sale of intoxicating liquors be granted in the Town for the ensuing year?"

- Article 4. To hear the annual report of the Selectmen and Overseers of the Poor, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, School Committee, Road Commissioners, Assessors, Tax Collector, Library Trustees, Cemetery Commissioners, Auditor, and any Committee whose duty it may be to report at said meeting, and act thereon.
- Article 5. To determine the method of collecting taxes and direct in regard to the payment of the same.
- Article 6. To fix the compensation of the Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year.
- Article 7. To see what disposition the Town will make of the dog fund, now in the hands of the Treasurer.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote a compensation to its Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to contract for electric lighting and make an appropriation therefor.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise a certain sum of money to harden the road from the canal bridge, near Michael Carmody's, to the East Longmeadow line.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will accept an act passed by the General Court in the year nineteen hundred and eight, entitled, "An act to provide for the protection of forest or sprout lands from fire."
- Article 12. To see if the Town will accept the legacy of two hundred dollars (\$200), as given to it by the will of Joanna B. Holt, late of Stafford, Conn., in trust, for the purpose named in said will.

- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen or other persons to prosecute violations of the liquor law, and raise and make an appropriation therefor.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will appoint an agent or agents to institute or prosecute or defend suits and actions at law to which the Town may be a party.
- Article 15. To determine the manner of repairing the highways for the ensuing year, and pass all necessary votes relating thereto.
- Article 16. To see if the Town will make a special appropriation for graveling a section of road under the direction of the Massachusetts Highway Commission.
- Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract with the Massachusetts Highway Commission for the graveling of a section of road in continuation of that done in the year 1907.
- Article 18. To see if the Town will accept the legacy of five hundred dollars (\$500), as given to it by the will of Joanna B. Holt, late of Stafford, Conn., in trust, for the purpose named in said will.
- Article 19. To see if the Town will adopt the provisions of Sections 21, 22, 23, 24 and 25, of Chapter 78 of the Revised Laws.
- Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to revoke its acceptance of the provisions of Section 336, of Chapter 11 of the Revised Laws, and vote to elect a Highway Surveyor under the provisions of Section 334 of said chapter.
- Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to elect its Selectmen at the next annual meeting in the following man-

ner: One for the term of one year, one for the term of two years, and one for the term of three years; and each year thereafter, one for the term of three years.

Article 22. To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer to borrow such sums of money as may be sanctioned by the Selectmen to pay the orders of the Selectmen in anticipation of the taxes of the current year.

Article 23. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges the ensuing year, and to carry into effect any vote or votes passed under the preceding articles, and to appropriate the same; also to vote how such money shall be raised.

And you are hereby directed to serve this warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at each of the three places designated by the town. Hereof fail not, and make due return of this warrant, with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk, at or before the time of meeting aforesaid.
