

Town Warrant

COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

HAMPDEN, SS.

To Edward P. Lyons, Constable of the Town of Hampden:—Greeting:—In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hampden, qualified to vote in elections and Town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall, on Monday, the fifth day of February, A. D. 1917, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles:—

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2. To choose a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, three Selectmen, who shall be Overseers of the Poor, one School Committee for three years, one Assessor for three years, one Collector of Taxes, three Constables, three Fence Viewers, one Cemetery Commissioner for three years, one Highway Surveyor for one year, one Tree Warden, one Library Trustee for three years, and one Auditor. Also to vote on the following question, the ballot to be "Yes" or "No": "Shall license for the sale of intoxicating liquors in this Town be granted?"—all to be on one ballot. Also to choose all other necessary Town officers. The polls open at ten-fifteen A. M. and may close at two-fifteen P. M.

- ARTICLE 3. To hear the annual report of the Selectmen and Overseers of the Poor, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, School Committee, Highway Surveyor, Assessors, Tax Collector, Library Trustees, Cemetery Commissioners, Auditor, and any Committee whose duty it may be to report at said meeting and act thereon.
- ARTICLE 4. To determine the method of collecting taxes and direct in regard to the payment of the same.
- ARTICLE 5. To fix the compensation of the Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 6. To see what disposition the Town will make of the dog fund, now in the hands of the Treasurer.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote a compensation to its Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen or other persons to prosecute violations of the liquor law and raise and make an appropriation therefor.
- ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will appoint an agent or agents to institute or prosecute or defend suits and actions at law to which the Town may be a party.
- ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract with the Massachusetts Highway Commission for graveling of a section of road as petitioned by the Selectmen and to make an appropriation therefor.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow

money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year beginning January 1, 1917, and to issue note or notes therefor, payable within one year, any debt or debts incurred under this note to be paid from the revenue of said financial year.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will authorize and provide sufficient funds for the publication of booklet or document which shall contain the 1917 valuation and taxation as determined by the Assessors.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50, to be expended within the Town under direction of the Hampden County Improvement League for the promotion of boys' and girls' club work, and the improvement of agriculture and country life in the Town, including agricultural demonstration work on land owned by the Town or owned by any resident of the Town, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 707 of the acts of 1914.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money to be used by the tree warden in co-operation with the Hampden County Improvement League in purchasing and setting desirable shade trees where needed along the principal streets.

ARTICLE 15. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges the ensuing year, and carry into effect any vote or votes passed under the preceding articles and to appropriate the same, also to vote how such money shall be raised.

And you are hereby directed to serve this Warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at each of the three places designated by the Town. Hereof fail not and make due return of this Warrant, with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk, at or before the time of meeting aforesaid.
