Ballard, 2; Miss Arline Howlett, 1; Ella Carder, 1. Gifts of pamphlets were received. The Springfield Red Cross has given us the subscription to the "Red Cross Courier." The Legion Post is sending the "American Legion" each month and Hampden County Improvement League is sending the "Hampden." A box of material for art classes in the First grades was received from Miss Ellis. We have also received several books from out side sources. These gifts are all appreciated and give us a wider range of reading.

The circulation was divided as follows: Magazines, 2159; Adult Fiction, 4041; Adult Non-Fiction, 917; Juvenile Fiction, 2828; Juvenile Non-Fiction, 947; Foreign Books, 14; Pamphlets, 18; Pictures, 7. The total attendance for the year was 7282 and made an average attendance of 48 for each day open. Four hundred and

thirty-two borrowers were registered. One hundred and forty books were borrowed from the State. Five hundred and fifty-five books were reviewed by the school children and seventy-six small and thirteen large certificates were issued. The number of volumes in the library was 5706.

In April it was decided to send out circulars through the schools concerning the damage to library books. For the benefit of those who did not receive one I am including it in this report.

TO ALL WHO USE THE FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY AT HAMPDEN

The Library Trustees have announced that since so many magazines and books have been maliciously or carelessly damaged, there will now be a 10c charge for each tear, mark, spots or other slight damage. Beyond repair, the book must be replaced by a new one. Books will be inspected before going out and on return. Loss of pages constitutes damage beyond repair as well as any damage which makes the book unfit for circulation.

HAZEL M. BURLEIGH, Librarian. April 24, 1940.

I would suggest that each one taking a book look it over and report any trouble at the desk, before taking it out. We examine all books before putting them back on the shelves but occasionally something does get by us.

The library has been open regularly on Monday afternoons during the year and will continue to be but will be closed for any holiday falling on Library days.

We have added the "Fur-Fish-Game" magazine because of the articles in it by a former Hampden boy who was a pupil of Mrs. Carew's. The articles are by Gordon Avery. The "Popular Science" Magazine was added as it

proved popular when given to us. A five volume set 'The Commonwealth History of Massachusetts' was added and gives us a more complete history of the State than we have had.

Books, pamphlets and magazines were exhibited at the Well Child Clinic following which we purchased Gunenberg "We, the Parents," Meek; "Your Child's Development and Guidance," Bell; "The New Baby," the last designed for use with a first child when the second comes.

Book Week was observed November 10-16. The caption this year being "Good Books—Good Friends." An interesting table was made with books brought in by the children as their favorite book at home. They also brought dolls representing book characters which we exhibited with the book containing that character.

Parents have responded to advice given by the Dental Hygienist in many ways. About five had dental care given by Dr. Fisk or family dentist since August 1940.

In regard to Nutrition, considerable time has been spent with Mothers, discussing weekly menus, and suggesting how to plan better meals.

The Clinic assumes responsibility of Toxiod Innoculations for Pre-School Children, 7 having taken advantage of this service last year.

To the Board Members, and others who have served the interests of the clinic, faithfully throughout the year, I wish to express my appreciation.

The 1941 Clinic will have to be conducted 4 days instead of $3\frac{1}{2}$ days. This will enable the staff to handle the children more efficiently.

AGRICULTURAL WORK

The agricultural service to local citizens during the year included soil testing, information and advice on farm financing, crop pest control, livestock disease control, crop production and marketing, agricultural engineering or construction, rodent control, farm management, woodlot improvement, and general agricultural information.

A number of farmers participated in the agricultural conservation program and adopted practices for improving their hayland and pasturage and conserving soil fertility in accordance with the recommended practices.

HOME BUREAU WORK

More than 100 women were enrolled in 7 different projects in the Town of Hampden during the past year. The Vegetable Preparation project was particularly popular to a number of mothers with large families and it apparently helped them greatly in their knowledge of food requirements.

Of special interest was the Home Furnishings project conducted by some very able local leaders.

In all 10 meetings and demonstrations were held and several home visits were made by the County Agents on request.

4-H CLUB WORK

Eighteen boys and girls were enrolled in three major 4-H Clubs during the year. They held 14 meetings and demonstrations and participated in exhibiting at the Community Fair.
