



ANNUAL TOWN MEETING -- Thornton W. Burgess School, Hampden

April 25, 1988

Moderator, Dalton Philpott opened the meeting at 8:00 PM.

Article 1. The Town voted that the annual reports, as contained in the Annual Town Report for the year 1987 be accepted as printed.

Article 2. The Town voted that the sums of money shown in the column entitled fiscal 1989 recommended of the of the Hampden Advisory Committee be granted and appropriated as amended for the specific purposes designated and that the same be expended only for such purposes, each number being considered a separate appropriation and that the Town raise and appropriate such sums as may be required to defray said charges for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1989.

Article 2A. The Town voted that budget items 60.0 through 69.0 be considered first. These items were subsequently reconsidered.

Article 3. The Town voted unanimously to authorize the payment of \$2,290 to Northern Tree Service and voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,290 for this purpose.

Article 4. The Town voted unanimously to raise \$31,936 for necessary road work on North Road, South Road, and Bennett Road or other roads as necessary; the sum of \$7,985 to be raised and appropriated and the sum of \$23,951 be borrowed under Chapter 44, Section 6A, said borrowing to be discharged by the proceeds of any reimbursement by the Commonwealth.

Article 5. The Town voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,600 for the purchase of a 1988 one-ton four wheel drive pick-up truck with plow, with a trade-in of 1983 Ford 3/4 ton pick-up truck owned by the Town.

Article 6. The Town voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,692 for the purchase of a 1988 tractor with a mower and snowblower, with a trade-in of 1978 Ford \$1600 tractor owned by the Town.

Article 7. The Town voted to amend the Zoning By-Laws of the Town of Hampden by additions, deletions, and substitutions as follows:

Delete Section 6.7.2.4 and substitute the following: The portion of any lot within the area delineated on the Hampden Zoning Map as flood plain and

wetlands district or other existing wetland as defined by M.G.L. Chapter 131, Section 40, may be used to meet the area and yard requirements for the district or districts in which the remainder of the lot is situated (provided the proposed construction site be a non-wetland or non-flood plain area of at least 75% of the minimum lot area requirements).

Add new Section 6.7.2.5: Where the bounds are in doubt, the burden of proof shall be upon the owner(s) of the land in question, to show where they should be properly located. However, the Town of Hampden retains its authority to determine the actual boundaries of the flood plain/wetland within the area in question.

- \$ 15,000--for---remodeling, reconstruction and making extraordinary repairs to the Town Garage.
- \$ 46,780--for---construction and reconstruction of outdoor recreational and athletic facilities.
- \$ 72,000--for---acquisition of a new dump truck and underground fuel storage tank.
- \$ 16,220--for---administrative fee.

That to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$1,850,000 under Chapter 44 of the General Laws, or for the school project, either under Chapter 44 or under Chapter 645 of the Acts of 1948 (as amended); that the Selectmen and for the school project, the School Committee are authorized to contract for and expend any federal or state aid available for the projects, and that the Board of Selectmen and the other appropriate Town Officers are authorized to take any other action necessary to carry out these projects.

Article 11. The Town voted to transfer from the Library FUnd the amount of \$2,332.50 (state aid) to be used by the Library Trustees at their discretion.

Article 12. The Town voted that in FY 1989 if additional state aid for the Library is received, this money be made available to the Library Trustees to be used at their discretion.

Article 13. The Town voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for the Conservation Fund to be used for the purpose of acquiring available land for the Town for conservation purposes, if such acquisition is voted upon and approved at annual or Special Town Meeting prior thereto.
