## Report of the Advisory Committee

From the viewpoint of the Advisory Committee this seems to have been the year of the schools. Education Reform, with all of its financial issues, and the Thornton Burgess roof occupied a large part of our time in the first part of the year. The second half was completely governed by K-12 Regionalization and all of the questions that came with that process.

As this year's budget process starts we hope to bring some of these issue to closure. We will have a K-12 Regional budget for the first time, Education Reform in place and the roof question is likely to be ready for the voters.

Having said all this, we do not expect this to be an easy year. We are still faced with funding for the Landfill closure/transfer station operation, Police manpower shortages, and Highway Department equipment problems, among others. All of this without any Stabilization money or leftover "Unappropriated and Available Funds Account".

As usual, it is important that you be informed at Town Meeting. Please attend the Budget Hearing on Monday, March 14, 1994 in the Town Hall Auditorium. It is your questions and concerns that drive our recommendations on these matters.

We would like to extend thanks and appreciation to Gordon Clark after more than a decade of service to this committee and wish he and Ellen best wishes in their retirement after a lifetime of service to their town.

## COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

TO: Either of the Constables of the said Town of Hampden in said County:

GREETING: In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Hampden qualified to vote in Town Affairs, to meet at Thornton W. ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the payment of any departmental bills of the year 1993-1994 or previous years, and will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money therefore.

## HIGHWAYS STATE AID

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept a sum of money from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under the provisions of local aid fund distribution, General Laws Chapter 33 Acts of 1991, and be allowed to borrow in anticipation of reimbursement, or take any other action relative thereto.

## HIGHWAYS STATE AID TOWN AID

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for necessary road work on North Road, South Road, Bennett Road or other roads as necessary, or take any other action relative thereto.

## HIGHWAYS PAVING

To see if the Town will vote to raise and ARTICLE 6. appropriate a sum of money for paving Town roads, or take any other action relative thereto.

## LANDFILL

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and/or transfer a sum of money to bond for the closure of the landfill, or take any other action relative thereto.

## LANDFILL

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of closing out the landfill; to determine whether this appropriation shall be raised by borrowing or otherwise; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for replacement or reconstruction of the roof on the Thornton W. ## WETLANDS PROTECTION **BY-LAW**

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Wetlands Protection Bylaws:

#### 12.1 Blasting:

Since rock excavation by blasting may directly impact the B.V.W., resource areas, superficial and/or groundwater elevations, flow directions, etc. the developer must employ the services of blasting specialists holding degrees (B.S. minimum) plus demonstrated experience in geology, seismology, geotechnical or equivalent to

oversee the blasting operations. As a minimum, the developer shall meet the following:

- (1). The Developer shall employ the services of a geotechnical seismologist or vibration engineer whose qualifications are satisfactory to the Conservation Commission and who shall sign and be responsible for the authenticity and correctness of seismographic reports. The Developer or his surety shall make inspections of the area of blasting prior to performance of blasting work and shall perform vibrations monitoring during blasting operations at locations approved by the Conservation Commission
- (2). The Developer shall submit to the Conservation Commission for approval a proposed blasting program prepared by the seismologist or vibrations engineer, independent of the developer and blasting contractor completely detailing the proposed methods of blasting including the type of information to be included in the blast monitoring seismograph reports as detailed hereinafter. The amount of vibration generated by blasting shall not exceed regulatory statutes or directives established by state or other authorities and will further be limited to provide a maximum permissible per component particle velocity of 1.9 inches/second or less if dictated by site conditions and adjacent structures, utilities, etc.
- (3). Approval of methods and procedures for initiating the work will not relieve the developer of his responsibilities in connection with the work, safety, direct or indirect damages to existing structures, B.V.W., resource areas, superficial and/or groundwater.
- (4). In the event that blasting activities are undertaken outside the buffer zone or resource area for the purpose of blasting boulders, the Developer shall provide the Commission with twenty-four(24) hours notice of time and location of blast.
- (5). In the event that blasting activities outside the buffer zone or resource area are planned for underground ledge or rock, the Developer shall provide the Commission fourteen (14) days notice of the time and location of the blast. The Commission shall be permitted to come onto the property and install monitoring devices for the purpose of identifying any impacts to the resource areas and to undertake other activities incidental thereto.

The Developer shall be responsible for the expenses related thereto, not to exceed FIVE HUNDRED (\$500.00) DOLLARS per blasting site.

## WETLANDS PROTECTION BY-LAW

(6). Prior to any blasting in the buffer zone or resource area, the Developer shall inquire in writing of the Commission whether the change is significant enough to require the filing of a new Notice of Intent. No blasting shall be undertaken until approval in writing is given by the Commission, or take any other action relative thereto

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to change from Residential R-6 District to Non-Profit Educational and Recreational District land described as follows:
